Our program is committed to protecting student, teacher, and staff health. To protect our community and follow the Department of Children and Families Office of Licensing, *The Tiny Tots Spot* tested our schools’ drinking water for lead and copper.

*The Tiny Tots Spot* tested all drinking water outlets for lead and copper at both locations per OOL guidance. All drinking water outlets were sampled were samples on January 16, 2023 and the results were received January 30, 2023. None of the outlets sampled exceeded the EPA limit of 15ug/L for lead and 1300 ug/L for copper.
